10TH May 2020

In the gospel this weekend Jesus says to Philip 'to have seen me is to have seen the Father'. We have often heard people say about a baby or a child that they are the image of their mother or father! Even adults will say that such a person behaves this way or that way like their mother or father. We can say the same about Jesus, He is the image of His Father. Everything that Jesus says and does shows us who God is and what God is like. Jesus is God in the flesh. For Christians our God is not to be found in a big house in the sky or floating around on a cloud socially distancing himself from humanity and creation, keeping at arms length from our messiness. No! Jesus who puts a human face on God shows us that the Father's house is not in the sky it is here among us in Ferrybank and Slieverue! At the beginning of his gospel John says that 'The Word was made flesh and lived among us' (John 1:14). This decision is taken in light of the guidance from NPHET: social distancing would be compromised and by their very nature the gatherings would invite families to travel long distance; further concern was expressed that large family groups might gather around a single grave and that the Mass might attract a large number of elderly people.
