You are Who you Eat!

Before you run scared at the above title just stop for a minute to consider what we are talking about. You have often heard it said that 'you are what you eat'! In other words what you eat can determine the quality of your health and your life in general. All of us from time to time have had to stop and take stock of the amount (maybe too much or too little!) and quality of the food we are ingesting. Maybe we did so on our own initiative or on the advice of a doctor. We all need food to sustain our lives our health and our energy & the type of food we eat can make a big difference.

This weekend the Church invites us to reflect on another kind of Food that is necessary for the journey through this life and beyond. This food is not something we eat but someone! Yes the Food that sustains us as Christians is a person - Jesus Christ. He said 'I am the Bread of Life'. He invites us to nourish ourselves with His Word, with every aspect of his being - human and divine. When we gather together for the Eucharist we accept the invitation of Jesus to celebrate his presence with us, to receive him, to be renewed in communion with him and with one another. Jesus wants us to 'become who we eat'. He wants us to become like him, to be people who share his love by allowing ourselves to be bread broken and shared for others.

In the Eucharist we celebrate and give thanks for the real and living presence of Jesus in the bread & wine but also in the various elements of our lives. We offer him our joys and sorrows, our hopes and dreams, our sinfulness and weakness, our family life, our work, our parish, our efforts to live the gospel. We do so praying that as bread & wine become his Body and Blood broken and poured out for us so our struggle to be church through the lived experience of our lives will be healed and given new life and energy.

The Eucharist and living a Eucharistic life are so important because it is through the Eucharist that we grow in communion as sisters and brothers of Jesus Christ. If you and I want to be Gospel healthy, the food necessary is the Eucharist. Without Him who is the Food of Life the journey will be too difficult for us. Remember: 'You are who you eat'!

As we make preparations to reopen our Churches over the next few weeks let us take time to reflect on what the Eucharist means to us. Is it evident by our lives that you and I have been partakers at the Table of the Lord and are looking forward to being so again? In what ways has the Eucharist sustained us over the past few months? Remember that even if we could not go to Church Jesus never stops being Eucharist for us. He always finds a way to feed us and to nourish us. All who know the importance of feeding on the Bread of Life will never be hungry.

Framework for reopening our Churches

The Bishops Conference has produced a framework for reopening our churches for the celebration of Mass. During the coming week our pastoral councils will be invited to reflect on that document and then we will move to organise a team in Ferrybank and Slieverue who will help to make it a reality. In the interest of keeping everyone safe and caring for the more mature among us it is envisaged that younger people might volunteer for this responsibility.
