The Most Holy Trinity

7th June 2020

Tenderness, Compassion, Patience (slow to anger), Forgiveness, Kindness, Faithfulness, Love, Peace, Grace, Fellowship or Communion. These are the characteristics associated with God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit in the Readings from the Word of God this weekend. Every time we invoke the Trinity by making the sign of the cross at the beginning of Mass or at the beginning of prayer we say we are blessing ourselves. However in a much greater sense we are being blessed by God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. We are being blessed with compassion, forgiveness, peace, love, etc. What God wants for us is that we would create a family a community a society where we model God as Trinity; in other words trying to do all we can to bless all the people we meet in life and indeed the world around us with the same gifts with which we have been blessed. Let us continue to bless ourselves so we can bless others.

On Friday it was great to hear some positive news from An Taoiseach when he announced that we will be able to return to our Churches for public worship on 29th June almost a month earlier than expected. However this good news is a time for serious preparation and not complacency. Over the next couple of weeks we will be implementing measures to ensure that we can open safely. The risk of contracting the virus has not gone away. We all still need to be careful and to respect each other and to observe social distancing, hand washing and other regulations.

The numbers permitted to attend funerals has also been increased from ten people to twenty five. This is indeed welcome news. However all funeral liturgies are still subject to restrictions. In our own parishes I have celebrated a number of funeral Masses recently and I have been deeply impressed by the solidarity shown by those families in the way they have observed the very painful restrictions in place. Not being able to celebrate the funeral of a loved one as we once did is a great sacrifice. However to make sacrifices for others despite our own pain. is a great act of Love. Thank You.

Groups who wish to book the Parish Centre in Ferrybank and Slieverue from September 2020 (if public health guidelines permit) should contact the Parish Office so that arrangements can be made with each group to complete the necessary documentation for use of the Centres and so we can prepare adequately for reopening and put in place Covid - 19 protocols.

Baptisms, Weddings & Funerals

Please remember that Baptisms, & Weddings can be celebrated with a minimum of participants and as long as social distancing is observed in accordance with Government Guidelines.

Funerals can be celebrated as long as the congregation **does not exceed twenty five people who are not cocooning** and as long as social distancing is observed in accordance with Government Guidelines.

This decision is taken in light of the guidance from NPHET: social distancing would be compromised and by their very nature the gatherings would invite families to travel long distance; further concern was expressed that large family groups might gather around a single grave and that the Mass might attract a large number of elderly people.
