Readers for Weekday Masses

We hope to get our daily reader rota up and running again in Ferrybank & Slieverue. If you are interested in being a Minister of the Word for our weekday Masses or would like to recommence please contact Fr Kieran or the Parish Office so we can put a new weekday rota together. Understandably due to the Covid situation the number of readers has declined so we would be grateful if some of you attending daily Mass might consider taking up the invitation. Daily readers will be required to sit in the sanctuary area before Mass begins and can return to their seats after reading.

Baptisms, Weddings & Funerals

All Church Services are subject to Covid-19 public health and diocesan guidelines. Baptisms can be celebrated with a group of no more than ten people (including parents and Godparents & child) per family in Church. All Baptisms including those celebrated by a visiting priest are to be booked through the Parish Office and registered in the Parish of Baptism. Dates & Times of Baptisms are available from the Parish Office.

Funerals can be celebrated as long as the congregation does not exceed fifty (50) people.

Weddings can also be celebrated as long as the congregation does not exceed fifty

Visiting priests are very welcome to celebrate family occasions. However all visiting priests are required to contact Fr Kieran in advance of these celebrations.

Ministry to the Sick

Please contact Fr Kieran or the Parish Office if you have a loved one who would like to receive the Sacrament of the Sick. Please have your eircode at hand when you call as you would for any other service provider. Visitation of the sick can only take place following a request from the family & not on second hand information. In the old days there was a tendency to call the priest at the last minute to anoint the person before death. This is no longer our understanding of the celebration of the Sacraments for the sick & dying. When a person becomes ill or receives a serious diagnosis that is the time to contact the priest so that they can be strengthened by the prayer of the Church community. It should also be remembered that because of the many commitments of priests today there is no guarantee that they can be available at a minute's notice.

Quite often we hear that families did not want to 'frighten' the sick person by calling the priest too early even though doctors and palliative care teams are already caring for a person. There is no need to be afraid, the visit of the priest will always be handled sensitively and no one will ever be frightened.

We will be in contact with those on our First Friday list soon to organise how best to recommence visitation in these strange times.

Unfortunately general visitation of hospitals & nursing homes is not possible at this time.

Collection Bags are not being passed around. A secure box is available at the entrance to our Churches for you to make a contribution. We deeply appreciate your generosity. Our Churches are sanitised after our Masses and other Services.

As we have continually reminded everyone over the past couple of months, adherence to public health guidelines is essential to prevent further spread of Covid-19 and anyone displaying symptoms, awaiting a test, or who has been diagnosed with Covid-19 should under no condition attend Mass or come into the Church. Those who have come to Ireland from a country not on the green list should isolate for fourteen days. To ignore any of these guidelines would be extremely reckless and put others in the community at risk. Anyone worried or concerned about symptoms should contact their GP and if advised, present for testing and isolate themselves from others. In such situations we should also inform public health authorities of all our movements and contacts when requested. If we are to curtail the spread of the Virus then we all need to play our part by protecting one another.
