Evening for parents of First Holy Communion & Confirmation Children

Why not join us for a virtual gathering to explore the importance of preparing to celebrate the Sacraments. Many in our parishes are preparing remotely for Sacraments that we hope to celebrate later this year. Join with Sacramental Theologian and Lecturer in Boston College, Rev. Celebrating Easter

At this stage it looks like we will not be able to gather to celebrate Easter in our Churches. Not being able to gather safely for weekend Masses & Easter is currently causing great sadness for people of faith everywhere. Nonetheless we will celebrate the Death & Resurrection of the Lord and bring those celebrations to you via technology and any way we can. During the coming week our pastoral councils will explore ways of celebrating Easter & helping families to participate so that we can continue to grow in communion with one another and with the Lord.

Having deceased loved ones prayed for at Mass and names in the Newsletter

Families who wish to have recently deceased loved ones whose funerals take place outside of the parish remembered at Mass and their names placed in the newsletter are welcome to contact the parish office and we will be delighted to include them. Names can only be included at the request of families or their representatives.

Visitation of the Sick and housebound

People are asking when will priests be able to resume First Friday & hospital visitation and attend funeral homes and homes for funeral prayers? The answer is – when it is safe to do so, when permitted by health authority guidelines & when priests have been vaccinated. No priest should put himself in a position to be infected or to infect others, to do so would be totally irresponsible. Please note that in the event of a family requiring the priest for someone who is seriously ill or dying there is no problem as a pastoral visit can be organised in a safe way. You are encouraged to do this as soon as possible when someone becomes sick so it is not left until the last minute as a priest may not be available at a few minutes notice. Please see our special leaflet available on our website in relation to ministry to the sick.

Funerals

The number of people permitted by the public health authorities and government to attend funerals in churches is ten people. People are asked not to gather outside churches or in the cemetery. The church observes these laws in the interest of public health & respect for life. No one would like to be responsible for the spread of the Covid Virus or indeed for the serious illness or death of a family member or friend.

We thank all bereaved families for their solidarity with others and we look forward to the day when everyone is vaccinated and when the level of disease has decreased to such an extent that we can gather to celebrate the funerals of our loved ones again.


