Pastoral Areas: Centres of Vocation Promotion

Bishop Nulty has announced a new initiative for the promotion of Vocations in the Diocese of Ossory. He is inviting each Pastoral Area Council to appoint a Vocations promoter who will liaise with Fr Kieran O' Shea the Diocesan Vocations Director and assist parishes in the task of promoting Vocations locally. A meeting of Vocations promoters from the various pastoral Areas will take place before the end of June. This undertaking provides an opportunity for synodality & acknowledges the important role that local faith communities play in fostering vocations to Priesthood in our Diocese. Speaking recently at the launch of an upcoming symposium on vocations and priesthood in Rome, Cardinal Marc Ouellett noted that synodality in connection with vocations, requires "close collaboration between lay people, priests and men and women religious, for the proclamation of the Gospel to the world through the attractive witness of Christian communities."

Meeting between Vocations Director & Diocesan Advisors


Fr Kieran O' Shea Ossory Vocations Director will meet the Diocesan Advisors to Primary & Secondary Schools in the coming weeks to explore ways in which children and young people in our Catholic Schools can be familiarised with the ministry & life of the Priest in the Parish Community & promote a culture of vocations.

On going Formation of Priests: Vocation & Ministry

The Vatican will host a Theological Symposium on Vocations on 17-19 February 2022, entitled "Toward a Fundamental Theology of the Priesthood". Each of the three days will focus on a different theme. The first day will be dedicated to "Tradition and New Horizons", the second to "Trinity, Mission, and Sacramentality", and the third to "Celibacy, Charism, and Spirituality". To coincide with this Symposium Ossory vocations and the Faith Development Group will facilitate a conference on Priesthood and Vocations in early 2022.

New channels of Discovery

Beginning in September 2021 a new programme will begin to assist young people in exploring important life questions and providing a space for them to take a first step on the journey of discovering their true calling. 

Saint Joseph: The Dream of Vocation

In his message for World day of Vocation 2021 Pope Francis invites us to reflect on three words that emerge from the life of St Joseph to whom this year has been dedicated and which in a special way can help us discern our own vocation. Saint Joseph suggests to us three key words for each individual's vocation. The first is Dream. God does not like to reveal himself in a spectacular way, pressuring our freedom. He conveys his plans to us with gentleness. He does not overwhelm us with dazzling visions but quietly speaks in the depths of our heart, drawing near to us and speaking to us through our thoughts and feelings. So too in a vocation: God's call always urges us to take a first step, to give ourselves, to press forward. There can be no faith without risk. Only by abandoning ourselves confidently to grace, setting aside our own programmes and comforts, can we truly say "yes" to God.

A second word marks the journey of Saint Joseph and that of vocation: Service. The Gospels show how Joseph lived entirely for others and never for himself. What a beautiful example of Christian life we give when we refuse to pursue our ambitions or indulge in our illusions, but instead care for what the Lord has entrusted to us through the Church! God then pours out his Spirit and creativity upon us; he works wonders in us, as he did in Joseph.

Together with God's call, which makes our greatest dreams come true, and our response, which is made up of generous service and attentive care. there is a third characteristic of Saint Joseph's daily life and our Christian vocation, namely Fidelity. How is such fidelity nurtured? In the light of God's own faithfulness. The first words that Saint Joseph heard in a dream were an invitation not to be afraid: these words the Lord also addresses to you, dear sister, and to you, dear brother, whenever you feel that, even amid uncertainty and hesitation, you can no longer delay your desire to give your life to him. He repeats these words when, perhaps amid trials and misunderstandings, you seek to follow his will every day, wherever you find yourself. They are words you will hear anew, at every step of your vocation, as you return to your first love.

Reflecting on the above quote from Karl Rahner, our Apostolic Administrator Bishop Denis Nulty invites us to consider the importance of the ministry of the priest as one who speaks of God in the community and society. Over these past few days I read an article in which a priest was reflecting on the areas of his ministry that give him life, in many ways I could see myself, and all of us, called to religious vocation in that article. A reflection that took as its starting point this wonderful quote of, the German Theologian, Karl Rahner. It, rightly, reminds us of the imperative of some saying something about God in our world.

"But must not some one of us say something about God...".

Priesthood and religious life respond positively to this need in our world today. A life lived in this way is a life lived for others, to remind them of how special they are in the eyes of God. The existence of a life of vocation in our communities is living proof that humanity is destined for more...

The life of priesthood which I have lived for the past thirty-three years has afforded me many opportunities to journey with people at the most sacred of times: at moments of birth, at the time of death, at the celebration of great love that is marriage and at many, many, wonderful sacramental celebrations of significant personal milestones. It is at these points, for many people, that dreams are hatched, futures are planned and goals are set. At these points, then, it is good that someone is speaking too of the divine possibility that is rooted in our human nature... Someone needs to whisper that, in these moments.

Going back to 1981, that dream brought me to the road of formation. A journey that I believe equips me, in prayer, for whatever challenges life throws up. Wake up the world... dream big... speak it today. Shift the gaze of others to higher horizons. Be a reminder of the divine that is present in every human being. Why not consider a life of Priesthood or Religious life?
