<u>Mass Readings</u> Gn 2:18-24 Ps 127,R/v 5. Heb 2:9-11. Mk 10:2-16

Gospel Mark 10:2-16 What God has united, man must not divide

Some Pharisees approached Jesus and asked, 'Is it against the law for a man to divorce his wife?' They were testing him. He answered them, 'What did Moses command you?' 'Moses allowed us' they said 'to draw up a writ of dismissal and so to divorce.' Then Jesus said to them, 'It was because you were so unteachable that he wrote this commandment for you. But from the beginning of creation God made them male and female. This is why a man must leave father and mother, and the two become one body. They are no longer two, therefore, but one body. So then, what God has united, man must not divide.' Back in the house the disciples questioned him again about this, and he said to them, 'The man who divorces his wife and marries another is guilty of adultery against her. And if a woman divorces her husband and marries another she is guilty of adultery too.'

People were bringing little children to him, for him to touch them. The disciples turned them away, but when Jesus saw this he was indignant and said to them, 'Let the little children come to me; do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs. I tell you solemnly, anyone who does not welcome the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it.' Then he put his arms round them, laid his hands on them and gave them his blessing.

Celebrating the gift of Human life

Feast of St Francis

This Monday 4th October we celebrate the feast of St Francis of Assisi. Francis mission began when he heard the words - "Go and repair my Church which is falling to ruin." - as he prayed before the crucifix in the ruined church of San Damiano. He soon discovered that his mission was not to rebuild a church of stone and wood but to help repair the true Church - the Body of Christ - the Church which is all the Baptised. The words Francis head ring out today too. We have a lot of repairing to do, after Covid yes but the need for repair was obvious long before Covid. All of us are called to continue the work of Francis today. Let us pray the guidance of the holy Spirit in this task.

The feast also marks the end of the 'season of creation' initiated by Pope Francis which began on 1st September. Let us pledge ourselves to live a lot more simply, to abhor waste of food and resources, to cherish the gift of creation more and above all to cherish the gift of human life.
