Reflection for young People Burning Questions Gospel Advent Sunday 3

When all the people asked John, 'What must we do?' he answered, 'If anyone has two tunics he must share with the man who has none, and the one with something to eat must do the same.' There were tax collectors too who came for baptism, and these said to him, 'Master, what must we do?' He said to them, 'Exact no more than your rate.' Some soldiers asked him in their turn, 'What about us? What must we do?' He said to them, 'No intimidation! No extortion! Be content with your pay!' A feeling of expectancy had grown among the people, who were beginning to think that John might be the Christ, so John declared before them all, 'I baptise you with water, but someone is coming, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to undo the strap of his sandals; he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing- fan is in his hand to clear his threshing-floor and to gather the wheat into his barn; but the chaff he will burn in a fire that will never go out.' As well as this, there were many other things he said to exhort the people and to announce the Good News to them.

Luke 3:10-18

What must I do in this situation or that? What must I do with my life? What must I do to deal with this issue or problem? What must I do to correct that mistake? What must I do to accept myself and others as I am and as they are? What must I do to be a good human being? What must I do to fulfil God's dream for me? What must I do to find peace and fulfilment?

These are the burning questions all of us grapple with. Who do we share these questions with?

As a general rule only ask questions like these of people who admit they don't have all the answers. Above all avoid those who claim that they are the answer to your questions. John the Baptist fielded their questions. He showed them how to prepare to recognise the Answer when he arrived. He was that point between question and answer, the one who allowed himself to be a space for them to ask and for the Answer to respond.

Questions for you

What are the big questions for you? Who creates a space for you to explore your questions?

Do you expect them to have all the answers? Are you comfortable with uncertainty & living with the big questions?
